

Saving of powers or rights already possessed by, or vested in, Governor.

3. Nothing in this Law contained shall be interpreted or construed as derogating from or affecting in any way any powers or rights already possessed by, or vested in, the Governor.

Date of coming into operation.

4. This Law shall come into operation upon its publication in the *Cyprus Gazette*.

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is necessary to make provision for such expenses of the Government of Cyprus for the year ending the thirty-first day of December, 1932, as are not already lawfully provided for or shall not hereafter be provided for by any Law.

BE it enacted:—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Appropriation Law, 1932.

Appropriation of £674,537.

2. In addition to the sums already lawfully appropriated to the service of the King or which may be hereafter lawfully appropriated thereto, there shall be issued and applied to the service of the twelve months ending the thirty-first day of December, 1932, out of the revenue and other funds of the Colony, any sum not exceeding the sum of Six Hundred and Seventy-Four Thousand Five Hundred and Thirty-Seven Pounds for defraying the charge of the Government of Cyprus for such period.

3. A sum not exceeding the amount set down under each head in the Schedule hereto may be issued and spent in respect of the Establishment or Service specified and referred to therein; provided that the total sum spent on Personal Emoluments during the year, appropriated under this Law, shall not exceed the sum of Two Hundred and Sixty-One Thousand One Hundred and Seventy-Seven Pounds.

4. This Law shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1932.
