A LAW TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF HORNS AND OTHER
NOISY APPLIANCES ON CERTAIN VEHICLES.

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Bulb Horns and Whistles Prohibition Law, 1933. Short title.

2. No person riding, driving or in charge of any bicycle or any vehicle other than a motor car or motor cycle shall carry thereon or sound any bulb horn, whistle, or any other appliance adapted for the making of an audible sound except only a bell. Prohibition of the use of horns, etc., on bicycles and other vehicles.

3. No person shall use, possess or sell a bicycle fitted with a bell which is operated by means of contact direct or indirect with either of the wheels of the bicycle or which can be operated so as to ring continuously without movement of the fingers. Prohibition of use of certain bells on bicycles.

4. Any person acting in contravention of this Law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten shillings and the appliance in respect of which the offence has been committed shall be forfeited. Penalty.

This Law came into operation on 27th January, 1933.

BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Imports Municipal Toll (Amendment) Law, 1933, and shall be read as one with the Imports Municipal Toll Law, 1932, (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Law"), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Imports Municipal Toll Laws, 1932 and 1933. Short title.

2. In section 3 of the Principal Law after the words "upon importation into Cyprus" there shall be inserted the words "or upon clearance from any Customs bonded warehouse".

3. The following section shall be added to the Principal Law :—

" Saving.

9. Nothing in sub-sections (2), (3) and (4) of section 6 and in section 7 of this Law contained shall apply to any Petroleum, matches or German tinder which has been imported into Cyprus or, if in any Customs bonded warehouse, has been cleared, before the 1st day of January, 1933."

BE it enacted :—

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Recovery of Compensation for Injury to Property (Continuance) Law, 1933.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained therein the Recovery of Compensation for Injury to Property Laws, 1930 and 1932, shall continue in force until the 1st day of August, 1933.
