BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Cyprus (Customs, Excise and Revenue) Order in Council, 1931, Amendment (No. 4) Law, 1934, and shall be read as one with the Cyprus (Customs, Excise and Revenue) Order and Laws, 1931 to (No. 3) 1934, (hereinafter called "the Order"), and the Order and this Law may together be cited as the Cyprus (Customs, Excise and Revenue) Order and Laws, 1931 to (No. 4) 1934.

2. The First Schedule to the Order is hereby amended by the deletion of the expressions

3. The Third Schedule to the Order is hereby amended by the insertion therein of the following as item 76:

"76. Cinematograph films depicting news, if the Comptroller of Customs and Inland Revenue is satisfied that they are of British Empire Origin,"

4. The Fourth Schedule to the Order is hereby amended as follows:—

- (a) By the insertion immediately after the words “Aircraft and accessories” of the words “other than aeroplanes and their parts”.
- (b) By the insertion in its proper alphabetical place therein of the following item:—
“Cinematograph films, other than films depicting news.. One-half of the full rate.”
- (c) By the insertion in their proper alphabetical places therein of the following goods among the goods charged with the payment of two-thirds of the full rate of duty:—
“Oils, edible.
Oils, not edible.”

A LAW TO AMEND THE CIVIL PROCEDURE LAWS,
1885 TO 1929.

1. This Law may be cited as the Civil Procedure (Amendment) Law, 1934, and shall be read as one with the Civil Procedure Laws, 1885 to 1929, (hereinafter called “the Principal Law”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Civil Procedure Laws, 1885 to 1934.

2. The following sub-section shall be added at the end of section 7 of the Principal Law:—

“(3) On the application of any party to an action the Court may, if it thinks fit, issue a request to a Court in a foreign country to examine a witness resident within the jurisdiction of such Court and may empower any party to the action to give in evidence therein the deposition of such witness taken before the Court in the foreign country or before a person to whom the examination may be deputed by such Court.”

This Law came into operation on 10th August, 1934.
