BE it enacted:—

1. This Law may be cited as the Foreign Tribunal Evidence (Amendment) Law, 1934, and shall be read as one with the Foreign Tribunal Evidence Laws, 1908 and 1933, (hereinafter called “the Principal Law”), and the Principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Foreign Tribunal Evidence Laws, 1908 to 1934.

2. Section 6 of the Principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion of the following paragraph at the end thereof:—

“Where the person taking the examination is not in His Majesty’s service, he may be paid a remuneration consisting of a fee of two pounds to which may be added a fee to be calculated by the Registrar of the Court at the rate of three pounds for each day of five hours.”

3. Section 10 of the Principal Law is hereby amended by the insertion after the words “or matter” in line 6 of the words “or proceedings pending or intended to be instituted”.
