A LAW TO AMEND THE STAMP LAWS, 1923 TO 1940.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows:—

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| 1. This Law may be cited as the Stamp (Amendment) Law, 1944, and shall be read as one with the Stamp Laws, 1923 to 1940, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law"), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Stamp Laws, 1923 to 1944. | Short title.

2. The Schedule to the principal Law is hereby amended as follows:—

(i) by the insertion at the end of item 4 thereof (relating to Bills of Exchange) of the following:—

“EXEMPTIONS.

(a) Any Bill of Exchange draft or order drawn upon any bank in Cyprus by an officer of His Majesty's Navy, Army or Air Force for the payment of money out of a public account;

(b) any Bill drawn by any person under the authority of the Admiralty, the War Office or the Air Ministry upon and payable by the Accountant General of the Navy, War Office or Air Force.”

(ii) by the insertion therein immediately after item 18 (relating to receipts or discharges for the payment of £1 or upwards including the Exemptions thereto) of the following item:—

“19. Undertaking to Shipping Agent for the delivery of goods pending arrival of shipping documents:—

(a) where no fixed sum is stipulated or where the sum stipulated does not exceed £50 £0.0.6.

(b) where the sum stipulated exceeds £100.. .. . £0.1.0.”
