A LAW TO AMEND THE CRIMINAL CODE (CONTINUANCE OF PROVISIONS) LAW, 1949.

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Criminal Code Short title. (Continuance of Provisions) Amendment Law, 1949, and shall be read as one with the Criminal Code (Continuance of Provisions) Law, 1949 (hereinafter referred to as “ the 12 of 1949 principal Law ”), and the principal Law and this Law may together be cited as the Criminal Code (Continuance of Provisions) Laws, 1949.

Substitution of section 49 of the Cyprus Criminal Code, 1928 to 1948, by new section.

2. For section 49 of the Cyprus Criminal Code, 1928 to 1948, which continues to have the force of Law by virtue of section 3 of the principal Law as though its provisions were set out in full in the principal Law, there shall be substituted the following section :—

“Seditious conspiracy and publications with seditious intention.

49. Any person who—

- (a) conspires with any other person or persons to do any act in furtherance of any seditious intention common to both or all of them ; or
- (b) publishes any words or document or makes any visible representation whatsoever with a seditious intention, is guilty of a felony and is liable to imprisonment for five years.”

Substitution of paragraph (6) of section 50 of the Cyprus Criminal Code, 1928 to 1948, by new paragraph.

3. For paragraph (6) of section 50 of the Cyprus Criminal Code, 1928 to 1948, which continues to have the force of Law by virtue of section 3 of the principal Law as though its provisions were set out in full in the principal Law, there shall be substituted the following paragraph :—

“(6) to promote feelings of ill will and hostility between different communities or classes of the population of the Colony :”

Substitution of paragraph (d) of the proviso to section 50 of the Cyprus Criminal Code, 1928 to 1948, by new paragraph.

4. For paragraph (d) of the proviso to section 50 of the Cyprus Criminal Code, 1928 to 1948, which continues to have the force of Law by virtue of section 3 of the principal Law as though its provisions were set out in full in the principal Law, there shall be substituted the following paragraph :—

“(d) to point out in good faith, with a view to their removal, any matters which are producing or have a tendency to produce feelings of ill will and enmity between different communities or classes of the population of the Colony.”
