THE STATUTE LAWS OF CYPRUS

No. 11 OF 1953.

A LAW TO AMEND THE DIPLOMATIC PRIVILEGES (EXTENSION) CAP. 202.
LAW.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as follows :—

1. This Law may be cited as the Diplomatic Privileges Short title.
(Extension) (Amendment) Law, 1953, and shall be read as
one with the Diplomatic Privileges (Extension) Law (herein- Cap. 202.
after referred to as “ the principal Law ”).

2. For sub-section (2) of section 2 of the principal Law there shall be substituted the following sub-section :—

“(2) The Governor may by Order in Council—

(a) provide that any organization to which this section applies (hereinafter referred to as ‘the organization’) shall, to such extent as may be specified in the Order, have the immunities and privileges set out in Part I of the Schedule to this Law, and shall also have the legal capacities of a body corporate ;

(b) confer upon—

(i) any persons who are representatives (whether of governments or not) on any organ of the organization or are members of any committee of the organization or of an organ thereof ;

(ii) such number of officers of the organization as may be specified in the Order, being the holders of such high offices in the organization as may be so specified ; and

(iii) such persons employed on missions on behalf of the organization as may be so specified, to such extent as may be specified in the Order, the immunities and privileges set out in Part II of the Schedule to this Law ;

(c) confer upon such other classes of officers and servants of the organization as may be specified in the Order, to such extent as may be so specified, the immunities and privileges set out in Part III of the Schedule to this Law,

and Part IV of the Schedule to this Law shall have effect for the purpose of extending to the staffs of such representatives and members as are mentioned in subparagraph (i) of paragraph (b) of this sub-section and to the families of officers of the organization any immunities and privileges conferred on the representatives, members or officers under that paragraph, except in so far as the operation of the said Part IV is excluded by the Order conferring the immunities and privileges :

Provided that the Order in Council shall be so framed as to secure that there are not conferred on any person any immunities or privileges greater in extent than those which at the time of the making of the Order, are required to be conferred on that person in order to give effect to any international agreement in that behalf.”.

3. The Schedule to the principal Law is hereby amended as follows :—

(a) by the substitution for the heading of Part II thereof of the following heading :—

“ IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF REPRESENTATIVES, MEMBERS OF COMMITTEES, HIGH OFFICERS AND PERSONS ON MISSIONS.” ;

(b) by the substitution for the heading and paragraph 1 of Part IV thereof of the following heading and paragraph :—

“ IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF OFFICIAL STAFFS AND OF HIGH OFFICERS’ FAMILY.

1. Where any person is entitled to any such immunities and privileges as are mentioned in Part II of this Schedule as a representative on any organ of the organization or a member of any committee of the organization or of an organ thereof, his official staff accompanying him as such a representative or member shall also be entitled to those immunities and privileges to the same extent as the retinue of an envoy of a foreign sovereign Power accredited to Her Majesty is entitled to the immunities and privileges accorded to the envoy.”.
