CAP. 106. A LAW TO AMEND THE HOURS OF EMPLOYMENT LAW.

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor and
Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Cyprus as
follows:—

Short title. **1.** This Law may be cited as the Hours of Employment
(Amendment) Law, 1953, and shall be read as one with the
Hours of Employment Law (hereinafter referred to as "the
principal Law").

2. Section 2 of the principal Law is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor :—

“Power to the Governor-in-Council to make orders limiting hours of work.”

2.—(1) The Governor-in-Council may, if he thinks fit and after considering any recommendations of the Labour Advisory Board in this respect, make an order fixing the hours of work whether daily, weekly or monthly, of persons employed in any occupation or business, either generally or in any specified area to which this Law shall be declared by such order to be applied.

(2) Any person who acts in contravention or fails to comply with the provisions of any order made under sub-section (1) shall be liable to imprisonment not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding one hundred pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine.

(3) For the purposes of this section “Labour Advisory Board” means the Board established by the Governor to advise on any labour matters and consisting of members representing employers and employees respectively under the chairmanship of the Commissioner of Labour.”

Repeal of section 2 of the principal Law and substitution of new section.

3. Section 4 of the principal Law is hereby repealed.

Repeal of section 4 of the principal Law.
