CHAPTER 317.

CUSTOMS (WHARFAGE DUES).

ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS.

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A Law to provide for the imposition of Wharfage Dues and for matters connected therewith.

[6th April, 1955.]

Short title.

1. This Law may be cited as the Customs (Wharfage Dues) Law.

Interpretation.
Cap 315.

2. Any word or expression used in this Law and defined in the Customs Management Law, unless the context otherwise requires, shall bear in this Law the meaning assigned to it by the former Law.

Levying of wharfage dues and exemptions. Schedule.

3. There shall be levied and collected upon all goods landed or shipped at any port in the Colony wharfage dues at the rates set forth in the Schedule, and there shall be allowed the exemptions set forth in the said Schedule.

Wharfage dues payable at specified shipping places. 4. The Governor may by Order in Council to be published in the Gazette direct that wharfage dues on goods landed or shipped at any shipping place specified in such Order shall be paid at the same rates as for goods landed or shipped at any port in the Colony.

Power to Governor to alter rates of wharfage dues and exempt goods therefrom.

- 5. The Governor may by Order in Council to be published in the Gazette—
 - (a) alter the amount of any wharfage dues;
 - (b) exempt any class of goods from the payment of such dues:

(c) re-impose the same;

(d) fix special rates for goods not specifically mentioned Schedule. in the Schedule.

Notes: Goods in bulk, not usually so carried, to be charged according to

the package generally used for them if not provided for above.

In the event of two or more cases or packages being hooped, tied or secured together into one bundle, each case or package is to be considered as a separate case or package in levying wharfage dues.

EXEMPTIONS.

- 1. Goods exported by or for the Government or any department of Her Majesty's Government; goods exported by Her Majesty's Forces (including goods imported for sale to Her Majesty's Forces which are being exported); personal baggage accompanied by the passenger; used empty sacks; empty barrels and outer packages (excluding jars or demijohns); salt; straw; mats for use as dunnage; bona fide stores and provisions for ships in port in quantities which the Collector considers reasonable; produce or manufactures of local origin for other ports in the Colony; specie; goods in packages not exceeding 250 mils in value accompanying a passenger on departure; shingle and sand.
- 2. Stores and equipment for vessels of war and for yachts used solely for the purpose of pleasure.
- 3. All goods certified by a properly authorised representative of the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration in Cyprus to be exported by or for the purposes of such administration.
- 4. Vehicles and goods exported by visitors exempted from wharfage dues under and in accordance with the Customs (Wharfage Concessions to Visitors) Order.
